501c(3) What?

I mention this because I had a similar feeling as I called Alice Li, our IRS agent, who has been growing impatient with me regarding our request for 501(c)(3) tax status. I thought, maybe she'll like our efforts enough to push us through. Wrong again! She did offer us a 501(c)(4) designation that, after a long discussion with the tax accountant, did not seem to fit our organization. Our gain would be so minimal (if anything) and we would inherit all the pains of compliance, it was decided to put that notion to rest and withdraw the request for 501(c)(3) tax designation as of June 5, 2009. Many reasons went into that decision and I will be happy to answer any questions. Sufficed to say we have laid that process to rest. There is a proposal in the works that will offer the same 501(c)(3) benefits to donators that will be discussed and possibly voted on at the next meeting.

Shows recognized by the East Tennessee Saddlebred Association will be posted on the official website - www.easttnsaddlebred.com and published in the newsletter. Members may request inclusion of other horse shows by a written request from three (3) separate members. If a show is more than 350 miles from Morristown, five (5) members must submit requests. Horse shows should come from the immediate area – Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Alabama, Virginia, West Virginia, or Kentucky. These requests should be made six (6) weeks prior to the show so all members may be notified of the affiliation. If possible, all shows should be affiliated by the beginning of the show season.
